

Flagger Training & Certification


Learn professional flagging techniques and proper work zone set-up in accordance with standards and guidelines of the Federal Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), Washington State Department of Transportation, and the Department of Labor and Industries Washington Administrative Code pertaining to flagging and temporary traffic control. Students passing the demonstration portion and 50-question exam will receive the Washington State Flagger Certification Card accepted in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana, and the American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA) National Flagger Certification Card accepted in most other states. Course includes references to the ATSSA flagging workbook, MUTCD, workshops, flagging demonstration, video, and PowerPoint presentation. Successful completion of the course certifies you for a period of three years. You must be 18 years of age to receive certification. Bring a pencil/pen to class. Refunds given if you withdraw at least 24 hours prior to the start of class. Cost is \$75. Instructor: Rich Bunker.

NEW! Introduction to Pine Needle Basket

Weaving

Pine needle art is one of the oldest crafts known. It dates back some 9000 years, even before pottery, which was made by lining twig baskets with clay. The indigenous people were the first to make pine needle baskets. They used a sharp piece of sea shell or bone as a needle. Some of the baskets were used for carting water, winnowing seeds, or as feed baskets. During the Civil War the women made hats of pine needles. They were sewn together with homespun threads. As transportation became more widely used raffia as well as sinew was used to sew the baskets. Raffia comes from the raffia palm which grows on the island of Madagascar, off the coast of Africa. However, today the art of pine needle basketry is still being done by a few creative people. There is no limit to what one can do with pine needles along with a little imagination and skills, which will come with practice and patience. Instructor: Theresa Shortman.

If you need a little boost before starting college level classes, there are a number of opportunities to improve your math and English skills. (Skill-level is determined by the college level placement test.)

English 098 and 099 are offered fully online and prepare students for college-level English.

Developmental math classes are taught via computer-based instruction, with face-to-face instructor support and guidance. (Because of social distancing requirements, a limited number of students are allowed in the face-to-face math lab. There are also online opportunities for those who prefer.)

Wildland Firefighter Certification

**CS 249R W 6-7:30pm 4/7, 4/21, 5/5, 5/19+ field day (5/22 or 23)
Virtual Sami Schinnell**

This certification course addresses the foundational skills universal to all wildland firefighters. The information is taught via a combination of virtual instruction consisting of four evening zoom sessions, plus online modules (approximately 30 hours of content), along with an 8-hour face-to-face field day for demonstrating skills and competencies.

The course covers entry-level firefighter skills including: Firefighter Training, Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior, Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service, and Intro to the Incident Command System. Successful completion of the course qualifies participants for certification as Entry Level Firefighter (FFT2) awarded through the National Wildfire Coordinating Group. Students must participate in one of the two field days - May 22 or 23 (8:30 to 4:30pm) - to be awarded certification. The field day will begin at CCEast in Morton and move to a nearby skills practice site. Participants must have adequate boots for the field day.
